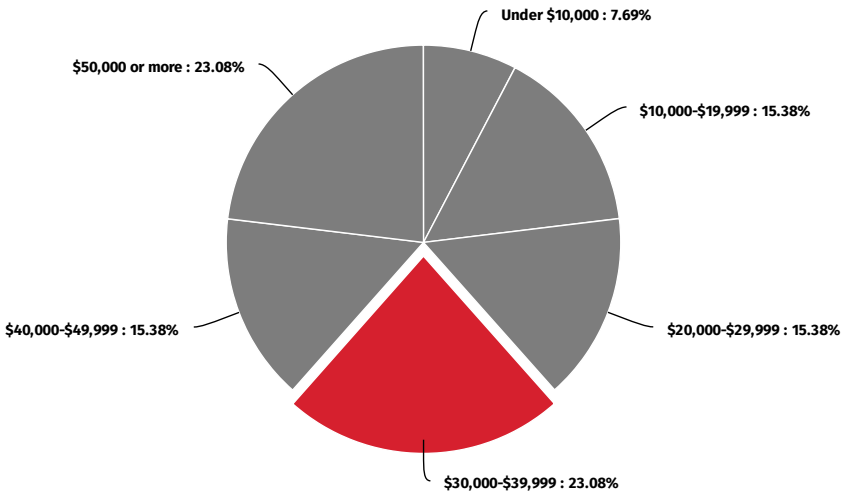

How many hours do you work per week?



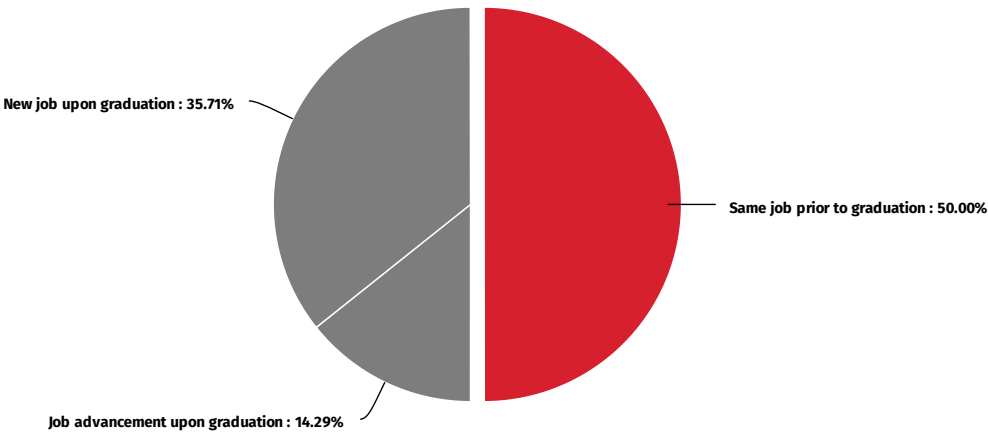

What range best depicts your personal annual income?



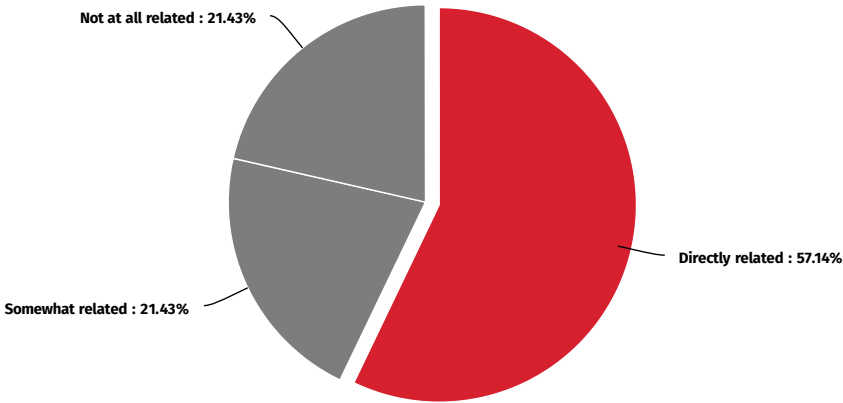

Which of the following best describes your current employment status?



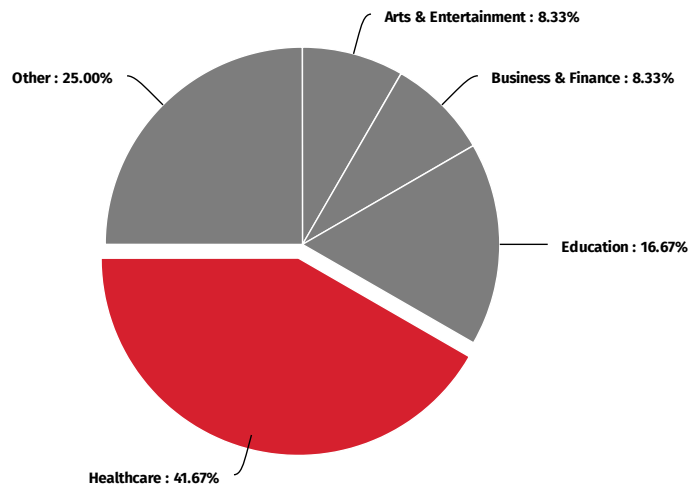

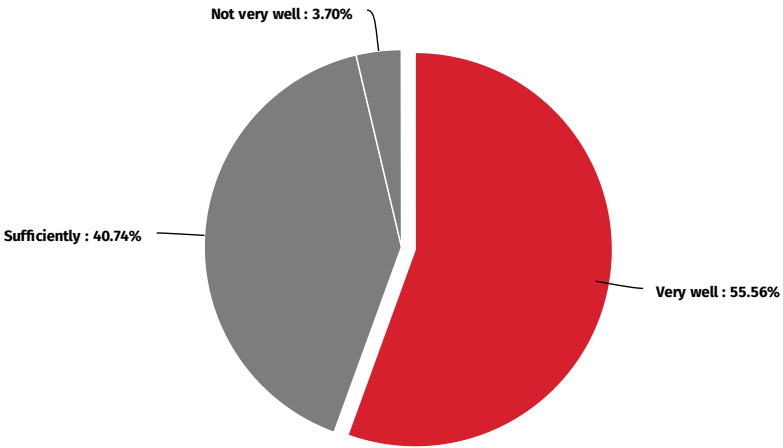
