

Why do ranchers brand their livestock?

Livestock are branded for identification and ownership purposes. Around 3,000 years ago the ancient Egyptians marked their livestock with fire-heated brands. In the 1500's the Spanish settlers brought the custom to the Americas.

How are branding irons heated?

Traditionally, cowboys would dig a pit into which they would place dry wood. They would build the fire and let it burn until only a bed of red-hot coals remained. The branding irons are placed into the hot coals not into an open flame. A more modern method is to use propane fuel and a burner placed into a steel pipe.

How do you read a brand?

There are three rules: 1. Read left to right. 2. Read from top to bottom 3. Read from the outside in.

How do you create a brand?

Brands are made up of symbols, number, and letters and are registered by their owner with their state Brand Board. They are usually simple designs that signify the cattle's owner or the owner's ranch.

- A half circle on the bottom is rocking
- A letter or a number on its side is called lazy
- Read top to bottom







- A shape around a letter, number or shape is the
- name read outside then inside.






Letters sharing a part are connected

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




