


Tutorial: Accessing Turnitin Feedback through Canvas

This tutorial demonstrates how to view comments from your instructor and the originality report for a paper submitted to Turnitin through Canvas.

1. Locate and click on the graded assignment you wish to view.

2. The instructions for the assignment will display. At the bottom of the page, click the button that says “Load Turnitin LTI API in a new window.”

Submit your Analytic Essay here by uploading your word processing file. Before submitting the essay, be sure to review the [Instructions: Analytic Essay](#) one, last time.

Be sure that

- your essay follows the instructions.
- your word processing file is named correctly and saved in the proper format (.doc, .docx, or .rtf).
- you have edited for grammar and spelling.
- your paper is presented in MLA format.
- you are uploading the correct file.



4. On the right side of the page you may use the controls to toggle grading comments and originality report. With both toggled on, you will see comments and the originality report at the same time.

Turnitin Testing

This is not an actual essay; it is a test of the turnitin plagiarism scanning and Grademark system. This tutorial will demonstrate how students can access and interpret their plagiarism screening reports. Then, the tutorial will show how to retrieve their professor's comments through the Grademark system.



Interpreting the Originality report:



- A school is an institution designed for the teaching of students (or "pupils") under the direction of a teacher or teachers, providing formal education, which is commonly compulsory in most countries. It consists of a series of schools. The names for these schools vary (see the list of school types below), but generally include primary school for young children and secondary school for teenagers who have completed primary education. An institution where higher education is taught, is commonly called a university college or university.
- It is necessary for students to think outside of the box. Routine thinking is boring and undesirable. According to John Taylor Gatto, "School didn't have to train kids to think they should consume nonstop; it simply taught them not to think at all" (23).

11. Note the two highlighted passages. Turnitin.com has identified these passages as coming from a source other than the author's writing.

12. The first passage is *not* enclosed in quotation marks and has no citation. The author has used source material and not cited it. Based on one or more passages like this in a paper, the professor will likely take action according to the policies in the course syllabus.

13. The second, red passage *is* enclosed in quotation marks. Also, a citation occurs right after the quoted material, and a bibliographic entry occurs for the source at the end of the paper. Even though Turnitin has highlighted this passage, the student is in good shape because the material is quoted and cited. Be sure to cite all paraphrased and quoted material from all sources.

14. Turnitin may also occasionally flag commonly used phrases like clichés or the titles of books. If turnitin.com highlights a few, isolated words, there is no reason for concern.

15. When you are done, you may close the Turnitin window and return to Canvas.
