




This tutorial demonstrates use of the Opposing Viewpoints database for finding sources appropriate for use in papers for ENGL 1110.




Under the Resources and services on the NMJC homepage, click on "Library."




On the library website, scroll down until you see the Opposing Viewpoints database. Click to open the database.




The search function works just as it does in Google. Type in a word or phrase relevant to the topic of research. Press “Enter” when you have typed in your search term.




Search results display in the center. The sources are categorized by the type of source. To see more sources of a particular type, click the subheading naming the kind of source.



Click on the title of a source to view the content.



When you are going to use a source for your assignment, you need to cite that source. To view the Works Cited entry to copy and paste into your Works Cited page, click on "Cite."



Copy the MLA Works Cited entry to your clipboard and paste it into your Works Cited page. After you paste the entry, be sure the italics remain where needed, and use hanging indentation for the entry. Remember that you must also use an in-text citation to match the Works Cited entry when using information from a source.
