This tutorial demonstrates accessing your originality report and feedback from your professor through the Turnitin.com LTI integration in Canvas.

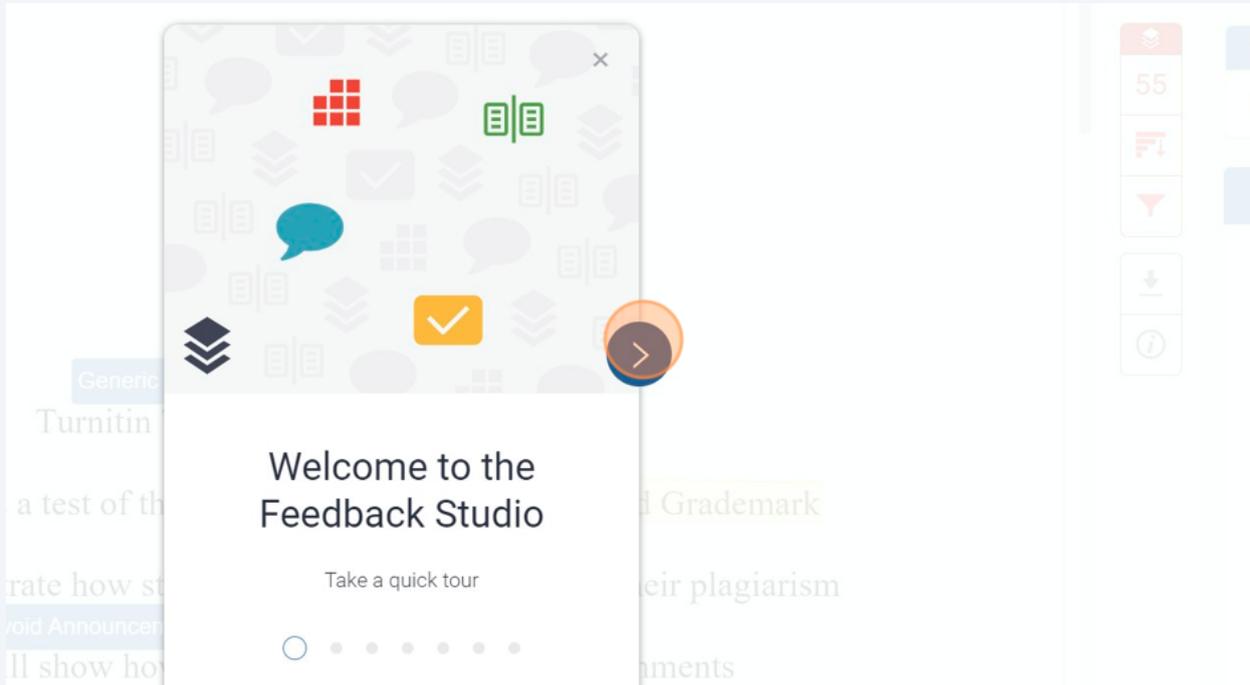

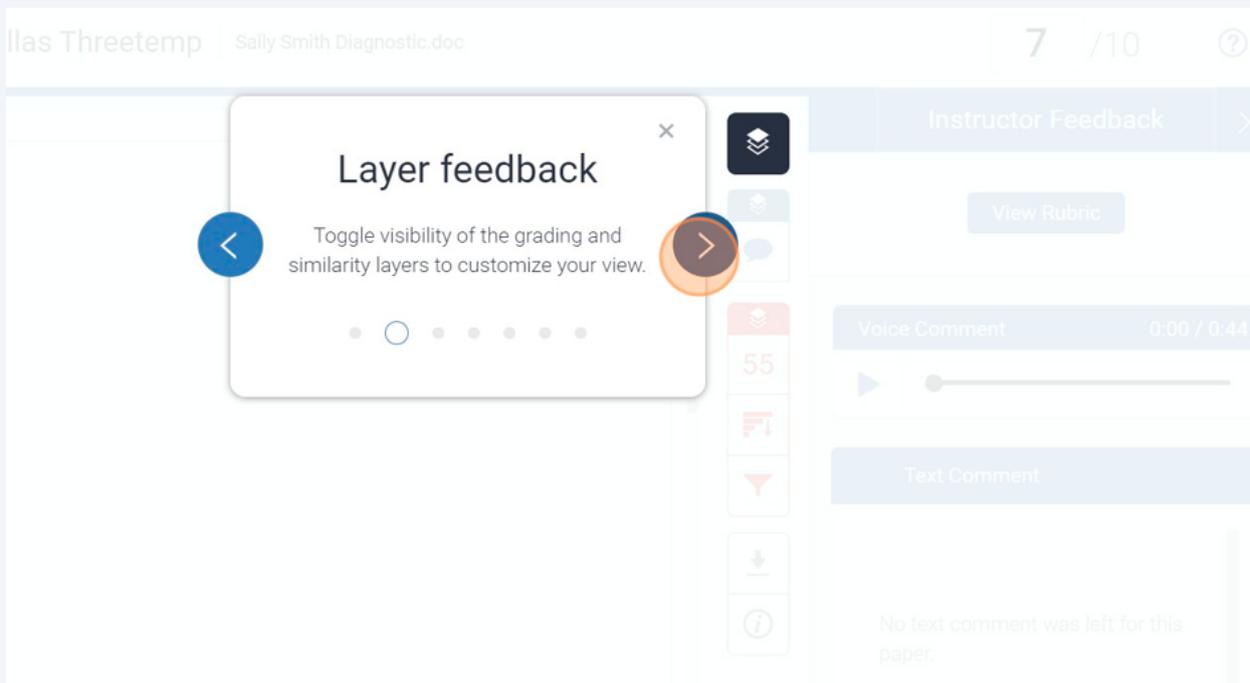

- 5 The first time you open feedback in Turnitin, an interactive tour displays:

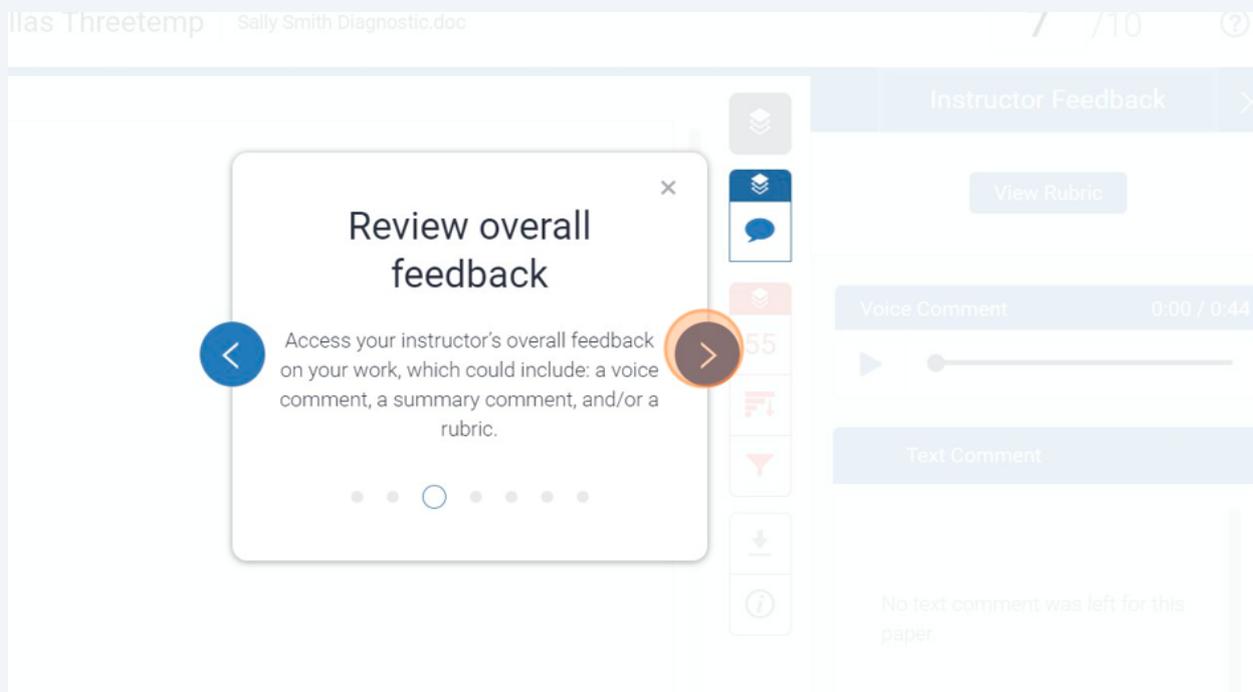


- 6 Click the forward arrow on each part of the tour. On this screen, we see that you can toggle the grading and similarity information on and off. In most cases, you will want to review both layers.



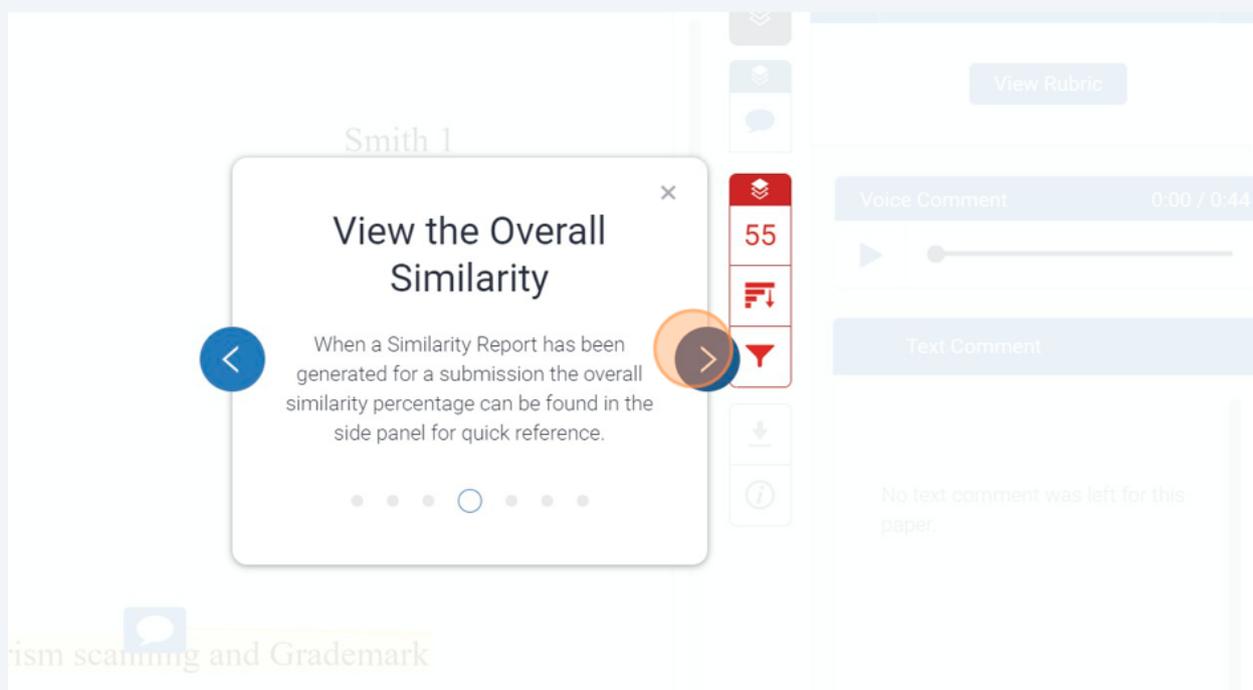

The overall feedback is where you will find overall text and audio comments from your professor on the whole assignment.

The overall similarity is the percentage of your paper Turnitin has matched to other sources. Generally, you want this number to be lower rather than higher. The overall similarity includes passages that use proper quotation and citation as well as those that do not. Review the report to be sure that highlighted passages are properly quoted and cited and to be sure the paper is not overusing quotations. Schedule an appointment with your professor if you have questions about the report.

Place your mouse over each of the blue highlight boxes to read each comment your professor has made on your assignment. Your professor may highlight passages of the paper to show you that a comment applies to the highlighted area. The highlighted passage may or may not be the same as the passages highlighted on the originality report. A professor may highlight passages for reasons other than pointing out originality. Your professor may also strike words, phrases, or passages with a red line to indicate the text should be deleted. Scroll through the entire paper, mousing over each blue box to make sure you have received all of your feedback.

Note the large passage highlighted in red. Turnitin has identified these passages as coming from a source other than the author's writing. The passage is not enclosed in quotation marks and has no citation. The author has used source material and not cited it. Based on one or more passages like this in a paper, the professor will likely take action according to the policies in the course syllabus, ranging from a zero on the assignment to failing the course.
