


How to Complete a Peer Review for an Assignment.

This tutorial demonstrates the use of Turnitin's PeerMark to critique another student's paper and read a critique done for you by another student. Because Peermark assigns you a paper to critique randomly from all of the submissions, you must submit a draft by the due date to write and receive critiques. Also, you will not receive the paper you need to critique until the due time for submitting a draft has passed. To begin, navigate to the Turnitin assignment as you did when submitting your draft, and click "PeerMark Reviews"



2 The papers you are assigned to critique will display. Click "Start Peer Review"



Accessing and Viewing PeerMark Feedback


1 To read a critique another student has written for your paper, navigate to the Turnitin assignment as you did when submitting your draft, and click "PeerMark Reviews" Remember that your reviews will only be available after the due date for critiques.

3 Once the PeerMark window loads, you will be able to read your feedback on the paper by clicking the icons in the main window and by reading the answers to the questions in the pane on the right side. keep in mind that the feedback in PeerMark is from your classmates; consider it, but doublecheck the feedback for accuracy, and if you are unsure about advice from another student, ask your professor for assistance evaluating the feedback
