

How to Apply to the NMJC Registered Nursing Program

Application Process

1. Students interested in NMJC's Nursing Program must first apply for admission to NMJC through the Registrar's office.
2. View the Registered Nursing Program Admission Requirements (links to these documents are located in the Nursing Menu). Please read these requirements carefully!
3. Prospective nursing students must complete 21 credit hours of prerequisite course work for the ADN (AASN) degree before being considered for the program. Please see an academic advisor for more information. A minimum GPA of 2.0 overall is required and a minimum GPA of 2.75 for the five (5) ranking courses is required.
4. Request transcripts from high school and other colleges to be sent to the Registrar's office for evaluation.
5. Prospective nursing students must send high school transcript or earned GED scores, as well as all college transcripts and transcript evaluations to the Registrar's office. It is the student's responsibility to request all transcripts and transcript evaluations be sent to the nursing department from the NMJC Registrar's office. 6. Students must take and achieve the minimum Adjusted Individual Total Score and the minimum Cut Scores for Reading, Math, Science, and English (see admission requirements document) on the ATI TEAS exam prior to applying for the program. The exam can only be taken three times in one year with at least 30 days between attempts. Only the TEAS scores achieved within the one-year period prior to the May 20 application deadline for application are considered.
7. **Download and Complete** the ADN application packet (all forms) and return to the Allied Health Building. **NOTE: The deadline for admission to the fall term is May 20th of that academic year.**
8. Students will be notified of their acceptance, waitlist, or denial status by June 15.
